(Good and bad of mobile technology)	<b>LG1:</b> to know how to name technology devices. <b>LG1:</b> to know the grammatical difference between <i>ce, ça, c'</i> <b>LG2:</b> to apply the knowledge of vocabulary to describe technology orally. <b>LG3:</b> to use speaking strategies to lengthen oral descriptions.			
2.2 F Tu t'en sers souvent ? (Discussing uses of mobile technology)	<b>LG1:</b> to know the vocabulary to describe device features. <b>LG1:</b> to know the conjugation of the irregular verbs <i>faire</i> and <i>aller</i> . <b>LG2:</b> to apply the knowledge to describe what devices you own and what you use them for. <b>LG3:</b> to use annotations to answer reading and listening questions.			
2.2 H Bienfaits et dangers (Discussing benefits and dangers of mobile technology)	<b>LG1:</b> to know the vocabulary of advantages and disadvantages of technology. <b>LG1:</b> to know impersonal structures starting with <i>il est..., il faut...</i> <b>LG2:</b> to apply impersonal structures to discuss advantages and disadvantages of technology. <b>LG3:</b> to use complex structures.			
Summative assessment: end of unit	<b>LG1:</b> to know the vocabulary and grammar from this unit. <b>LG3:</b> to use listening, speaking, reading and writing exam skills to complete an end of unit assessment.
