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Non-Uniform Day Guidelines

On occasion, students at Oldbury Wells will be allowed to wear clothes that are non-uniform. These occasions include non-uniform days to raise money for charity, for school trips or as a reward.

Whilst as a school, we encourage every student to express themselves as individuals, this must be done in an appropriate manner, therefore, it is important that the following guidelines are adhered to:

Skirts, dresses or shorts should be at least mid-thigh length.

The following items are prohibited:

- See-through clothing e.g. shirts/blouses
- Strapless tops
- Clothing that exposes bare midriffs
- Flip-flops or backless shoes (health and safety reasons)
- Clothing with offensive words or logos
- The usual rules for jewellery and piercings.

The expectation is that all students arrive to school wearing clothing in accordance with this dress code. Should they not do so, students will be sent home to change. Any student unable to go home will be required to work in the consequence room for the day, including social times.

If a student has PE on a non-uniform day, they will be expected to bring in their PE kit to school as normal (in line with PE uniform policy). Students that have not brought their PE kit with them to school will be sanctioned in the normal manner for missing kit.
