TrustEd Update New Sports Partnership



We are pleased to announce that the South-east Shropshire sports partnership will be joining us next year. At present they run very successfully from Idsall School. They are moving as an organisation to run from the TrustEd Schools' Partnership, based here at Oldbury Wells School in Bridgnorth from September, with Idsall School remaining a vital partner school.

"We are very excited to have this wonderful organisation join us in September," said Sarah Godden, CEO of the Trusted Schools' group. "Our local schools have all benefited from the partnership over the years, and it is with great pleasure that we are able to announce that the service will be joining us. I have worked with Chris Jew and his team for many years, and have more recently seen for myself the benefits of the service in our Schools."

"We are so pleased to have 28 schools signed up to work with the partnership next year, with four secondaries and twenty-four primary schools!" said Chris Jew, who leads the service. "The service next year will build on how we have worked historically and will be called the TrustEd Sports Partnership."

The service will still be using a dedicated team of experienced PE teachers from each

of the four secondary schools, to do the work with the twenty-four primary schools. These secondary schools include Idsall School, which will be a highly valued school in the partnership, with strong experience and expertise in community Sports. The other schools are Oldbury Wells School, Bridgnorth Endowed School and William Brookes School.

This service already provides a great range of sporting activities for pupils. They also lead staff training in the primary schools and run a Sports' Leader programme with older pupils. This summer they are running several summer schools for primary aged pupils, alongside ourselves.

"We are really looking forward to working with the TrustEd Sports Partnership next academic year. They have done tremendous work with us historically and we are so pleased they will be building up their work with our school into the future," said Rebecca Lee, Headteacher of Castlefields School.

Lee Tristham said, "The new service will be great for our pupils I am sure, and indeed pupils across all of the schools locally. I am particularly pleased they will be re-establishing the work they do in helping older pupils become Junior Sports Leaders, which was put on hold because of Covid. At Oldbury Wells we look forward to being able to host sports events again, for primary schools which are coordinated by the Sports' Partnership."

Teachers across the area of Bridgnorth have worked together this term to share writing examples from their Year 6 pupils. This was part of a range of joint activities local teachers have been involved in.

"When the government announced that there would be no primary tests this year, local schools decided to work together with a joint approach. This has been very helpful for us in secondary schools because we will have the same information from all of our main feeder schools when pupils move up to us in September," said Mr Tristham, Headteacher of Oldbury Wells School.

"Can I express my thanks to all of the Year 6 teachers who have been part of this, and the school leaders who organised it."

"It was such a pleasure to read such high-quality work from pupils across our local primary schools," said Carol Aston, Head of School at St Mary's Bluecoat Primary. "It was also very helpful to be able to work with colleagues across our area on this joint process."

The joint work for reading, writing and maths was coordinated by Claire Gaskin (Executive Headteacher of the Trinity Group), Sarah Godden (CEO of our group, TrustEd Schools' Partnership) and Tom Plim (Headteacher at Highley School).

Carol Aston (Head of School at St Mary's Bluecoat) led the session itself and hosted the event. Participating schools were, Alveley School, Beckbury School, Castlefields School, Claverley School, Highley School, Morville School, St John's RC School, St Leonards CE School, St Mary's Bluecoat School, Stokesay School and Worfield School.

Good luck to all those staff moving on, we look forward to introducing our new staff from the start of September.

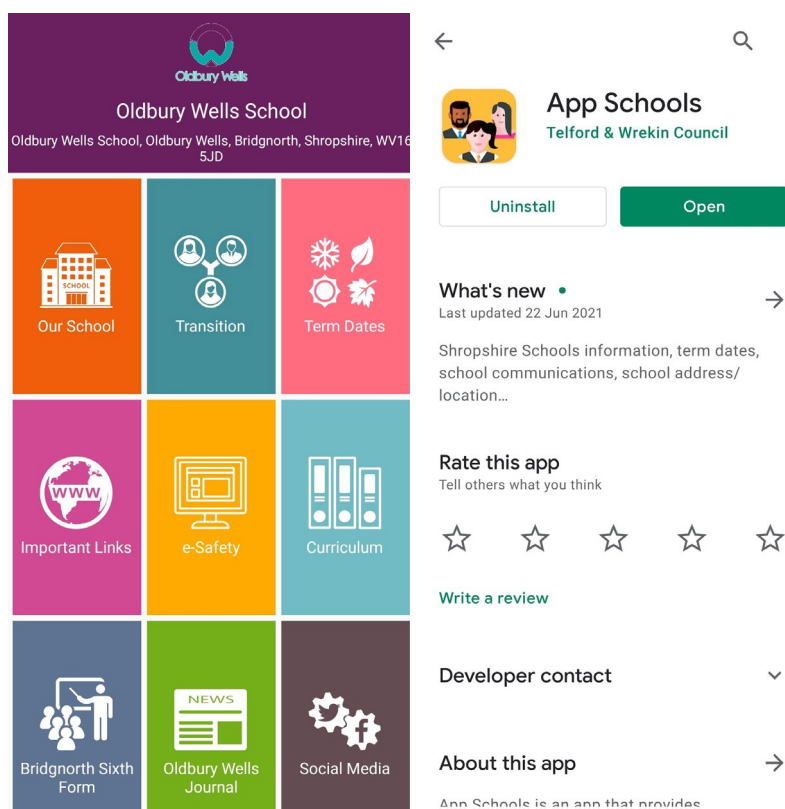

Caterlink Generation Juice Machines

There has been a lot of talk around school about our two new Generation Juice machines!

In a fight against plastic waste, our new machines hold 500 drinks each, overall saving 1000 plastic bottles!

Students can purchase tokens from the canteen for 85p, and “can the can; throttle the bottle” by bringing their own reusable bottle to school and filling it with a flavour of their choice.

Each drink is 100% school compliant, infused with vitamins and minerals, and promotes hydration through chilled drinks including redberry, apple, cherry, lemon, mango, ginger and elderberry. Each drink is 100% gluten and lactose free, vegan, and use natural flavours and real juice. Each year, every person throws away 34kg of plastic packaging just on their own! Most of this plastic cannot be recycled, causing irreversible damage to our environment.

His win means that Dan can go onto take part in the Schools International Athletic Board; a competition between England, Wales, Scotland and Ireland. Dan is very excited about this prospect, and also about getting an England vest.

As well as these achievements, Dan has been asked to take part in an England Training camp for Triathlon at Leeds University next week, which could lead to more exciting opportunities. Sustainable Bridgnorth



Mr Hailes' year 9 group have had a really positive reaction to this environmental campaign, and it has been their chance to make a difference.

100% of students from year 9 have made pledges which is a fantastic achievement. 54% pledge to refill water bottles, 17% will carry reusable shopping bags, and 29% want plastic free lunchboxes.

Mr Hailes is very impressed and proud of the initiative used by the Year 9 students. Their proactive nature in committing

to their pledges and supporting one another has shown resilience, and a real care for the environment and their local community.

Sustainable Bridgnorth is a volunteer group working towards reducing our impact on the environment. They are supporting Plastic Free July to reduce the use of plastic items and are encouraging 5000 households in Bridgnorth to replace one plastic item to encourage sustainability.

Some of their top tips for reducing plastic usage are:

- Use reusable shopping bags
- Avoid bottled water – try to refill your bottle
- Carry a reusable cup
- Don't use cling film
- Buy loose fruit and veg
- Refill your cleaning products
- Use soap and shampoo bars
- Avoid using wipes

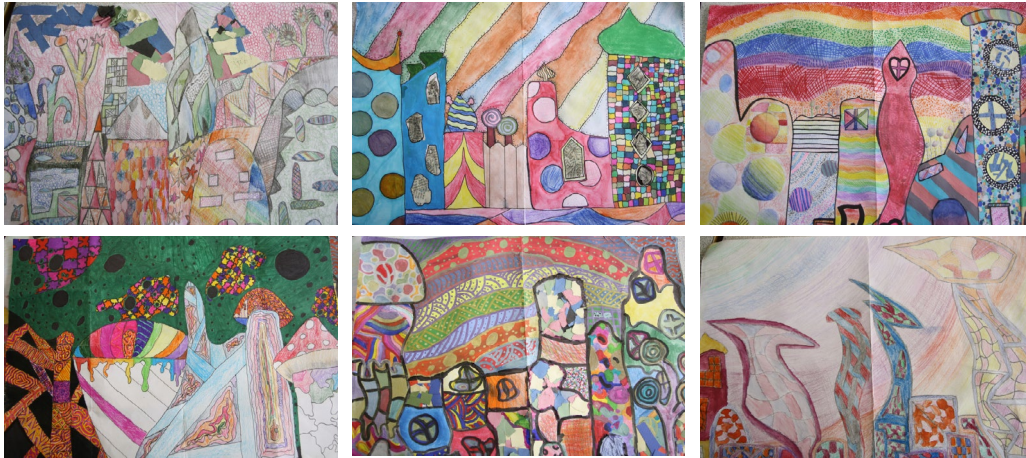
The second unit was more imaginative and intuitive where they used inspiration from Zentangle patterns to create their own artwork.
