UKMT Maths Challenge

Over 100 students from years 7, 8, 9 and 10 have participated in this year's UK Mathematics Trust Challenge. Students competed with people from all over the country and even against students at international schools to test their problem solving and maths skills.

Our students achieved some fantastic results including lots of bronze, silver and gold certificates. In the intermediate challenge Ryan Fletcher-Aleixos achieved a gold result and the best in school certificate. On the junior challenge Archie Grove, Luke Lowe and William Harman all achieved gold results with Luke and William achieving matching scores and both receiving best in school certificates.

Ryan Fletcher-Aleixos, Tom Gregg, Olly Smith and Lawrence Wood all achieved high enough scores in the intermediate challenge to qualify for the next stage of the competition where they all received very respectable scores.

British Schools Modern Biathlon Championships

Callum Blower qualified for National Finals

Callum Blower has done OWS proud in the Schools Biathlon Championships, after qualifying for the National finals held at the University of Bath on 19th and 20th March.

Callum was competing against the top 50 performers in the country over the 2 disciplines of swimming and running. He took part in 100m swim and 1600m run, finishing 14th in the swim with a time of 1:10.11 and 22nd in the run completing it in 5:43.22. Both of these times were new PB's for

Callum, he knocked 10 seconds off his previous run PB after some coaching from former OWS student Dan Galloway. This put Callum in a finishing position of 17th overall, which was an improvement of 5 places for him from the competition last year!

What a fantastic performance from Callum to be the top 20 competitors in the whole country! We wish him all the best in his qualification for the competition again this year.

This past weekend, Y9 pupil Will Parton represented us in the Shropshire School County Athletics Championships and put in a cracking performance in 3 events. Georgia Pratley awarded next Lord Lieutenant Cadet

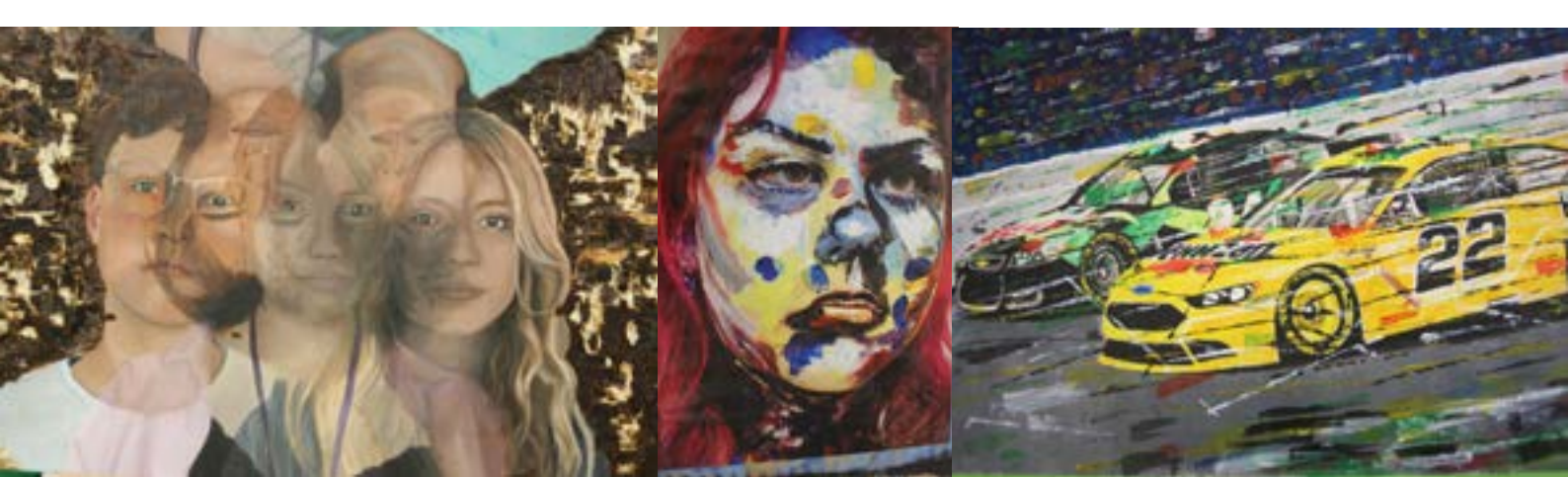
Bridgnorth Sixth Form student Georgia Pratley has been awarded the next Lord Lieutenant's Cadet, which means she will work alongside the Lord Lieutenant Mr John Crabtree MBE on behalf of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. Her new role will also see her representing the whole of the West Midlands Air Cadets which is a huge honour and achievement. Georgia said "I am really proud to have been appointed and I can't wait to see what the next year will bring".

Georgia is from the 451 (Stourbridge) Squadron and at the start of April, she attended the RAF Air Cadets National Choir, a huge honour following a tough application process. She has been in the National Choir since 2019, and since then has been awarded the best female voice award. Georgia has been part of the air cadets for over five years, and during her time with them she has climbed the ranks from Cadet to now Flight Sergeant of her Squadron. She attended the American Air Base Rammstein in Germany to learn and work for 11 days, and has worked at the Royal International Air Tattoo Air Show.



Georgia has also worked extremely hard to achieve a place on the prestigious Qualified Aerospace Instructors Course (QAIC) which involved a very tough selection process accepting just 40 Cadets from across the UK. The course involved her spending some weekends away at Inskip, and also partaking in online weekend sessions. She is due to finish the course during the holidays where she will qualify in RAF Cramwell. She will then be a qualified Aerospace Instructor which allows her to teach at Air Shows and in wider RAF Cadets. Georgia has also been given an Air Cadets Pilot Scheme Scholarship to do her first solo flight in Scotland next March, an amazing achievement.

Georgia attends Bridgnorth Sixth Form, part of Oldbury Wells School, and is also achieving highly in her classwork. Last year she did her EPQ, achieving an A* and was awarded a commemorative Air Cadets coin from the Air Commandant for her hard work. She is taking her Grade 8 for Musical Theatre in May, and from there is hoping to achieve a scholarship at Birmingham University to continue her music whilst studying medicine. Head of Sixth Form Mrs Bishell said; "We are very proud of Georgia as she is not only aiming so high academically but also engaging in so many valuable extra-curricular activities. She is a real inspiration and role model for our students."

Safeguarding

As a school we take the safeguarding of our students and staff very seriously. We have robust policies in place which are clearly defined and help the smooth operation of the school ensuring a calm, safe and purposeful environment for all members of the community. We recognise the responsibility that all adults have within school to keep students safe and so ensure that all staff receive appropriate training and support to ensure they are kept upto speed with most recent guidance. Our school, as is the case within all schools, has Designated Safeguarding Officers who are there to offer support and guidance where needed, and if required signpost where additional support may be found. Our website holds a range of information about the work which takes place across the school; should there be any issues parents students wish to discuss you are encouraged to make contact with the school.

Our school site is kept safe and secure throughout the day, this is supported by the effective use of CCTV across the school which includes a recent upgrade within key areas where students felt more monitoring and supervision would be useful. This work included the introduction of some CCTV in communal areas of key toilet facilities which were installed ensuring that privacy for all students is maintained, while helping monitor where required open areas and main entrance points. Students have fed back that this has led to less students meeting in these areas and therefore being more confident about being able to use the facilities throughout the day. This development alongside the many other safeguarding procedures across the school ensure that students can confidently and safely go about their school day being focused on doing their very best.

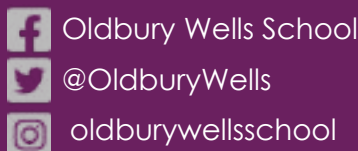
