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<u>Newsletter:</u> We will shortly be sending out the end of term Journal which captures brilliantly the range of activities, events and opportunities students have been involved with. Please spend time to take a look and use this to speak to your child about their involvement and commitment to try new things in the new year; there are some wonderful examples of the great work and opportunities students have supported.

<u>Communication</u>: Over the summer we will keep communication to a minimum, although will send out any important reminders when staff are in school on results days. A reminder that we use social media to give an insight into events in school, please look to follow us on Facebook and Instagram to keep updated with what's going on.

<u>School Uniform</u>: As we look towards September, we ask parents for their support with regards to school uniform. We know that over the summer many items of uniform are updated, parents should refer to the school website which gives clear guidance on uniform requirements (<u>Uniform | Oldbury Wells</u>).

Although the majority of our students have the correct uniform and wear this with pride, at present we are having to highlight with some students, issues related to footwear which is of a trainer style and therefore not acceptable; inappropriate style and length of school skirts; alongside an increase in students having facial piercings or multiple earrings which are not acceptable. Our policy is clearly outlined on the school's website, we would ask all parents to look at the information carefully to ensure that all requirements are met.

We have had some questions regarding the type of school tie and the new tartan skirt. To confirm:

- School Tie: Years 7,8,9 Lower school tie (purple); Years 10&11 Upper school tie (grey).
- Skirt The new style Trutex GST Gisburn Tartan Skirt is the <u>compulsory</u> skirt for Year 7 students from September 2024. All other year groups are asked to make the switch to this style when updating uniform. This skirt will then be the only option of skirt type from September 2025.

<u>Return to School in September:</u> We have the usual staggered start at the beginning of the new term to support everyone's return to school as outlined below:

- Staff PD days Monday, 2nd September & Tuesday, 3rd September
- Year 7&11 only Wednesday, 4th September
- <u>All student return</u> Thursday, 5th September
